



Cameras with a Control Box




Step 1 If your camera is **solar-powered**, remove the connector with a silver collar from the control box by hand-twisting the collar counter-clockwise.



If your camera is powered by **110V**, unplug the 110V cable from the control box. Repeat to remove the other end of the power cable from its power source.

Step 2 Disconnect the camera system from the control box by twisting the protective cap(s) on the camera connector(s) counter-clockwise. Remove the connector(s) by pressing the clip to release the connector(s), then twist the hanging protective cap(s) onto the device input(s).



Step 3 Remove the camera system from its mounting location. If it was pole mounted using steel straps, safely dispose of straps, being aware of sharp edges.


Preparation

Step 4 Thoroughly clean off all equipment using a microfiber cloth. All equipment must be completely dry before placing inside the hard case to prevent water damage.

Step 5 Place the lens cap on (not applicable to PTZ cameras).

Step 6 Wrap the camera and control box separately in bubble wrap. Secure bubble wrap with tape.

Step 7 Pack into the hard case and add extra packing material to avoid shifting.



Cameras without a Control Box

Interior Multi-Camera

Step 1 Remove the connector with a silver collar from the camera by hand-twisting the collar counter-clockwise.




Step 2 Remove the camera system from its mounting location. If it was pole mounted using steel straps, safely dispose of straps, being aware of sharp edges.

Step 3 Thoroughly clean off all equipment using a microfiber cloth. All equipment must be completely dry before placing inside the hard case to prevent water damage while in transit.

Step 4 Pack into the hard case.



Shipping the Equipment

110V Cameras

Step 1 Email a picture of the open packed case to <u>leasing@truelook.com</u>. Our team will confirm if it's ready to ship or provide suggestions for more secure shipping.

Step 2 Once the case is approved to ship, close the hard case and ensure all latches are properly shut.

Step 3 Place your shipping label into a luggage tag (not included) and attach it to the hard case handle.
